CREATING OPPORTUNITIES THROUGH LITERACY, EDUCATION AND RECRUITMENT

In 1993, the Dollar General Literacy Foundation (DGLF) was created to honor co-founder, J.L. Turner, who was functionally illiterate with only a third-grade education. We continue his legacy by supporting students of all ages along their educational journey.

Since its founding, the DGLF has supported more than 24,000 organizations, including schools, libraries and non-profits, helping nearly 24 million individuals learn to read, prepare for the high school equivalency test or learn English.

Additionally, DG partners with several historically Black colleges and universities (HBCUs) that have disciplines applicable to DG's business needs. Our activities include career fairs, student mixers and move-in events, and various special events at our partner HBCUs.

NOURISHING NEIGHBORS

Through our partnership with Feeding America, we help nourish our neighbors in need through financial support and in-kind food donations from DG stores and distribution centers to local food banks across the country.

We are also proud to celebrate our longstanding partnership with St. Jude Children's Research Hospital's *Thanks and Giving*® campaign, which advances research, provides quality care and helps ensure that families of patients never receive a bill for treatment, travel, housing or food.

SUPPORTING OUR COMMUNITIES

In the wake of catastrophic events including hurricanes, tornadoes, floods, fires and earthquakes, we are there for our hometowns across the country, providing support and restoring hope.

Since 2001, DG has provided the American Red Cross with corporate and in-store donations to help prepare for emergencies, supply vital resources to communities when disaster strikes and support recovery efforts.



DG's partnership with World Central Kitchen includes a new Rapid Response Field Kitchen, which provides nourishing meals in communities following natural disasters and other crises. The custom-designed, all-terrain vehicle quickly accesses hard-to-reach communities and can provide up to 3,000 hot meals and 1,500 sandwiches each day to our neighbors in need.

PROTECTING THE PLANET THROUGH REFORESTATION AND HABITAT RESTORATION

DG is committed to being a good environmental steward. As we work to advance our sustainability efforts, we thoughtfully consider strategies that reduce our environmental footprint, preserve natural resources and ensure the vibrancy of the communities we call home. Since 2021, DG has partnered with the Arbor Day Foundation to restore more than 848 acres of forest and more than 434,000 trees.
