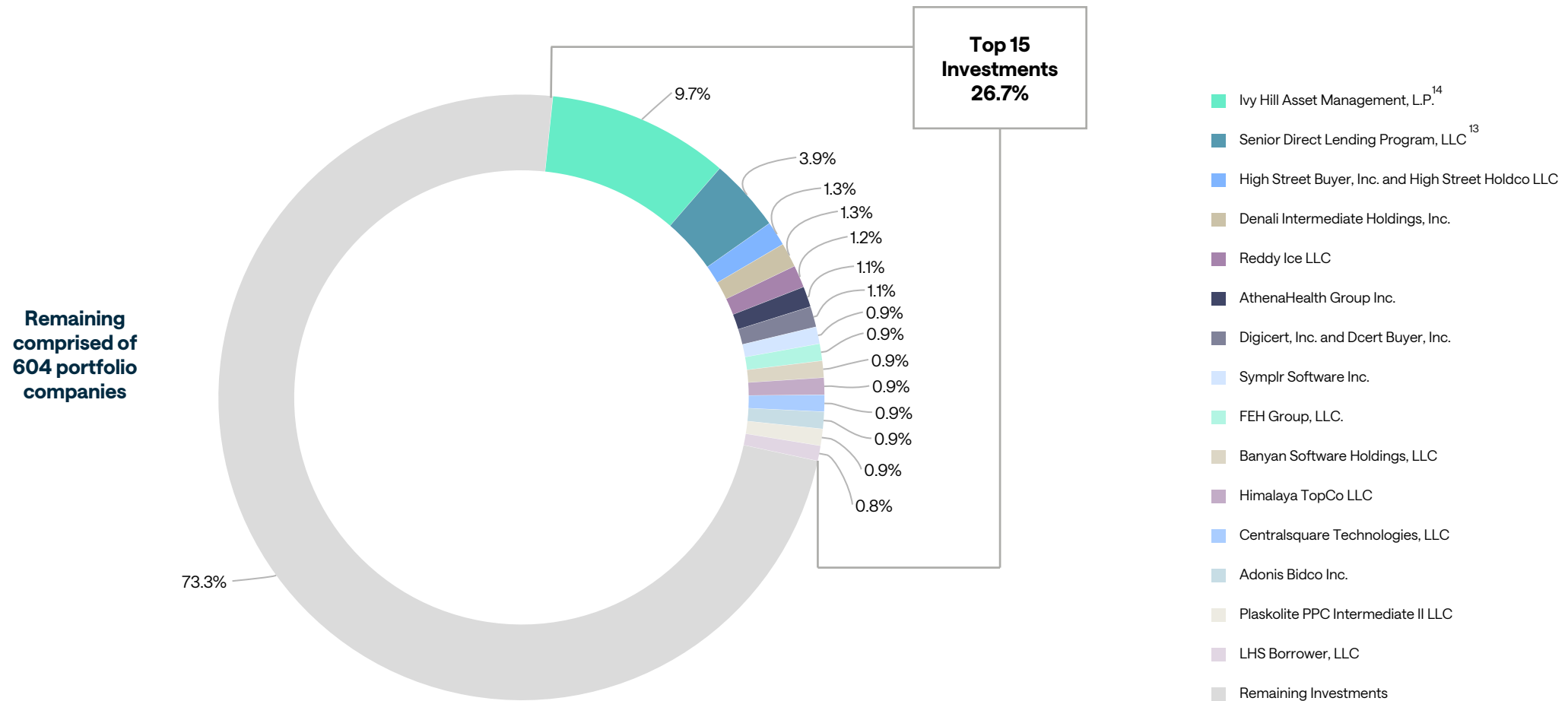

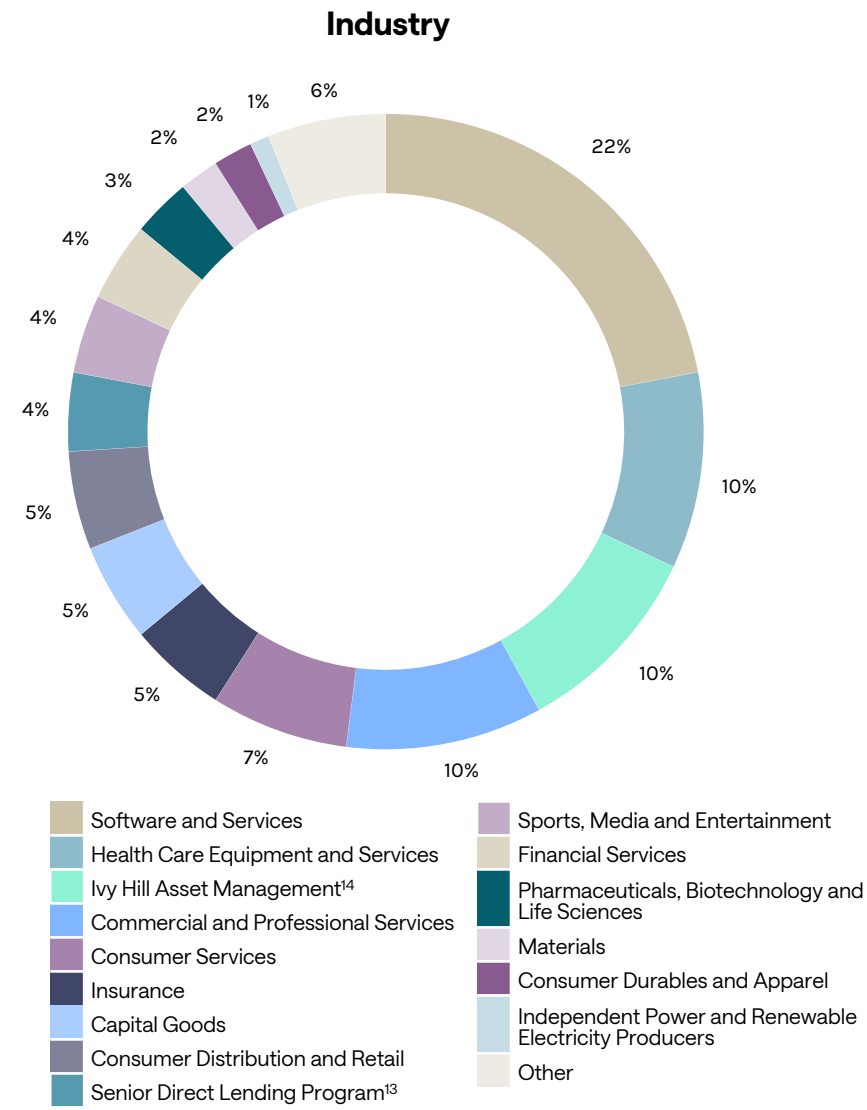
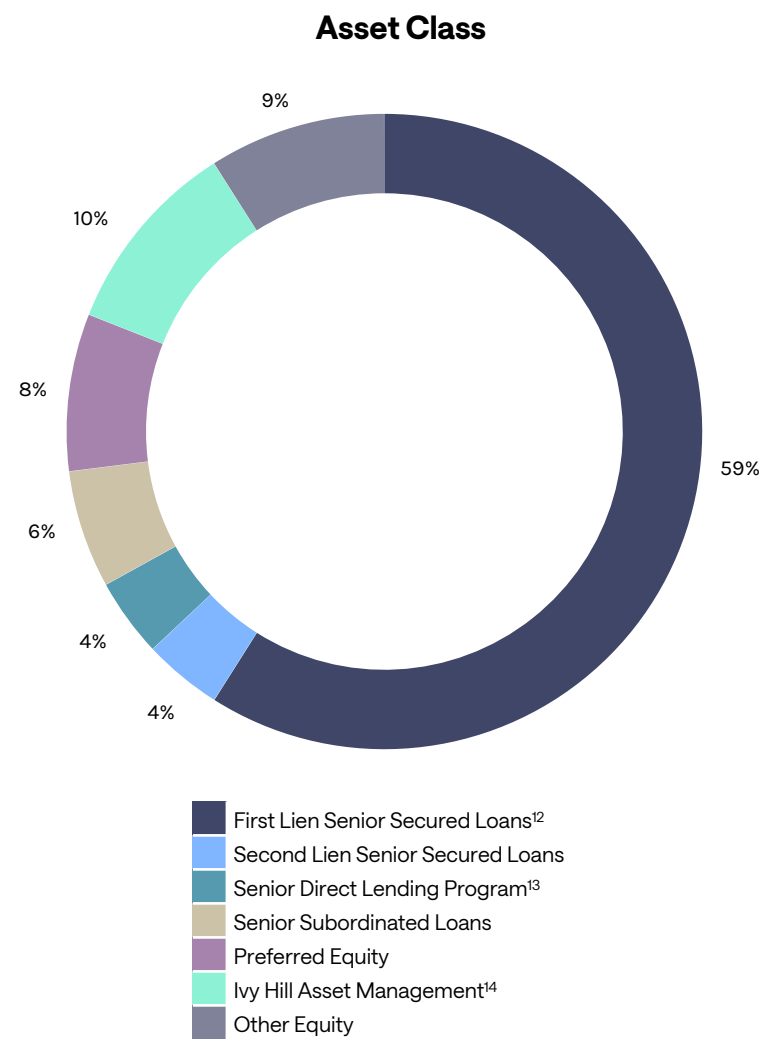

Investment Portfolio by Issuer as of June 30, 2026*

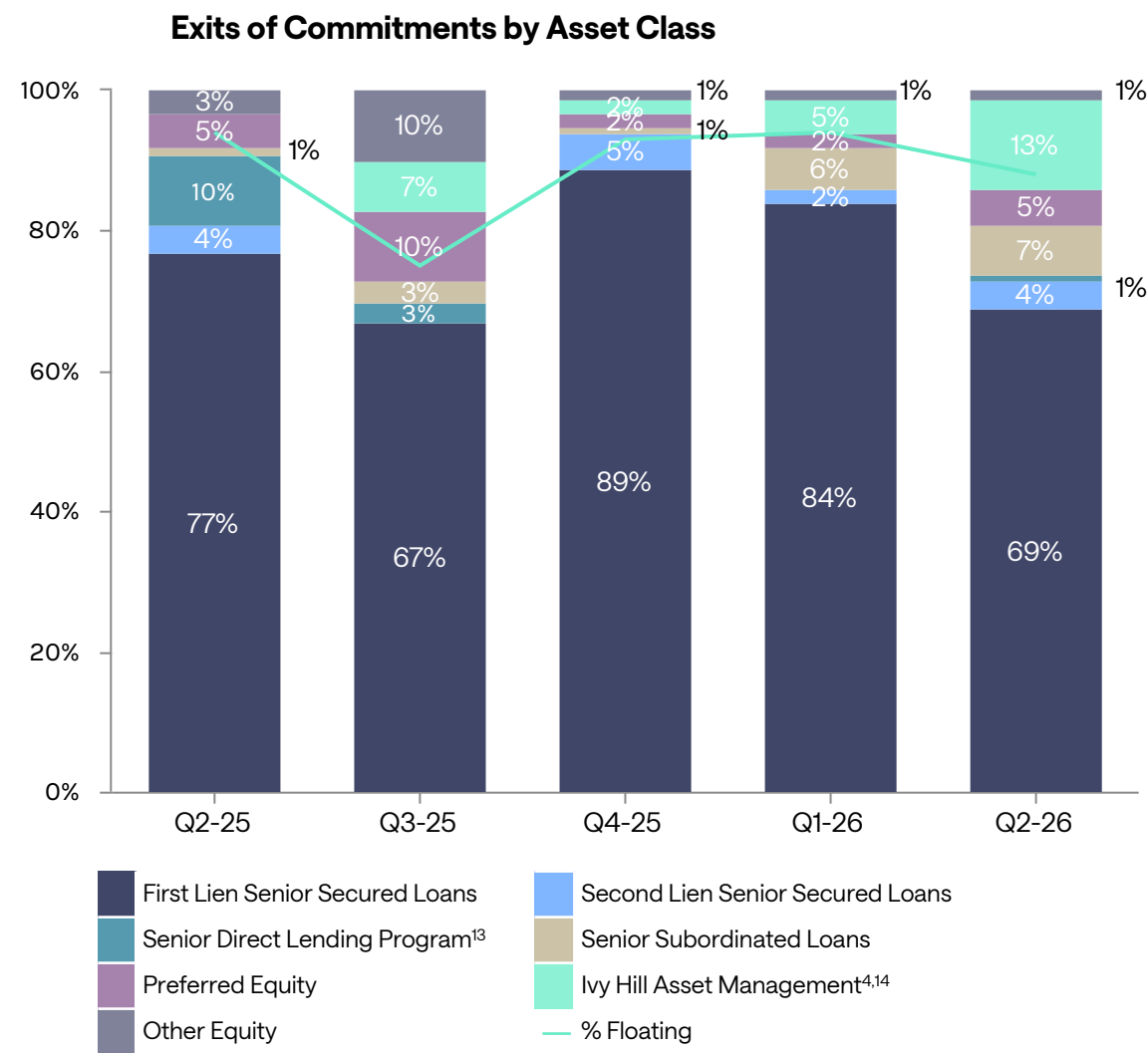
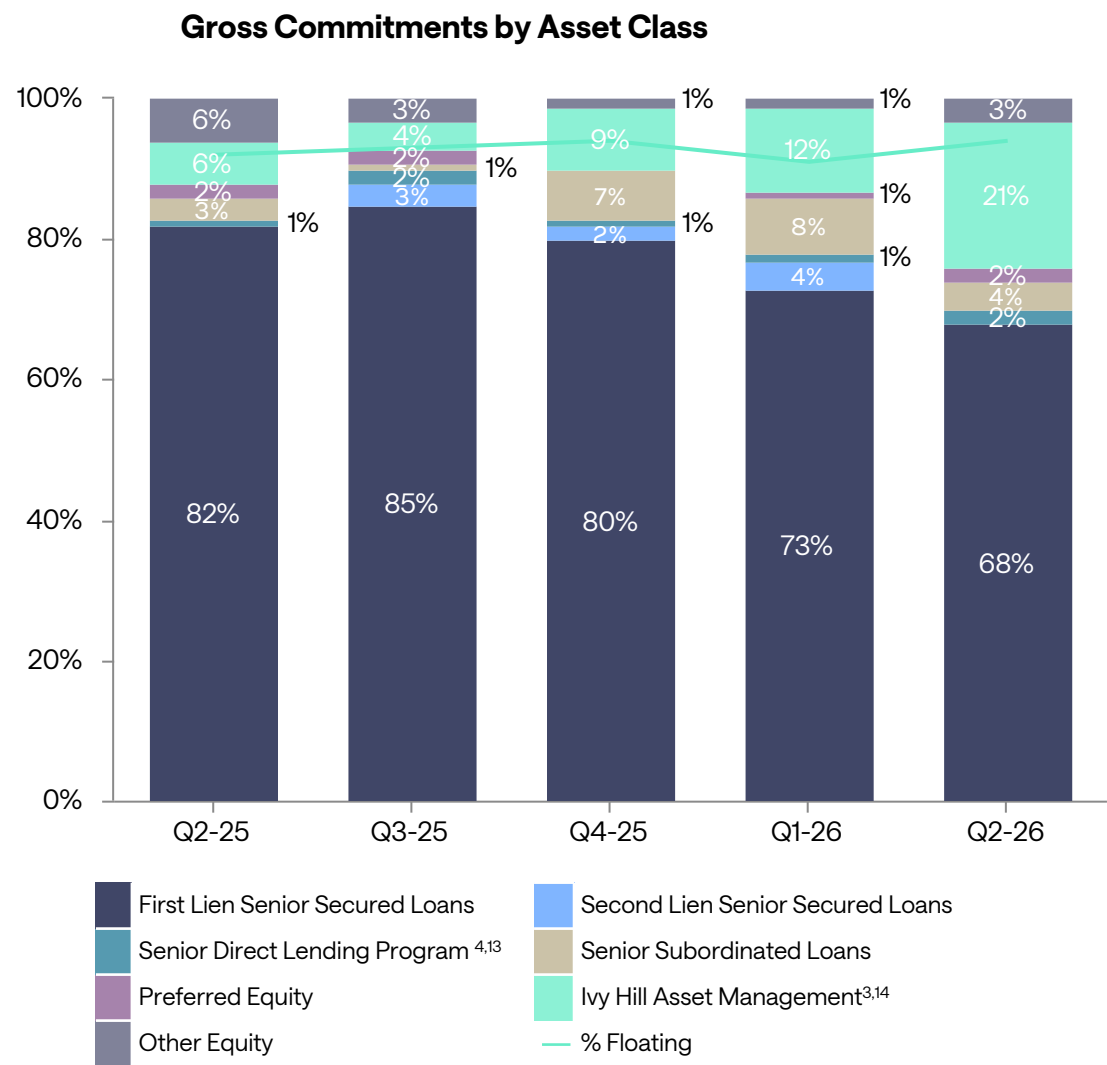


Diversified \$29.3 billion portfolio with 619 portfolio companies¹¹

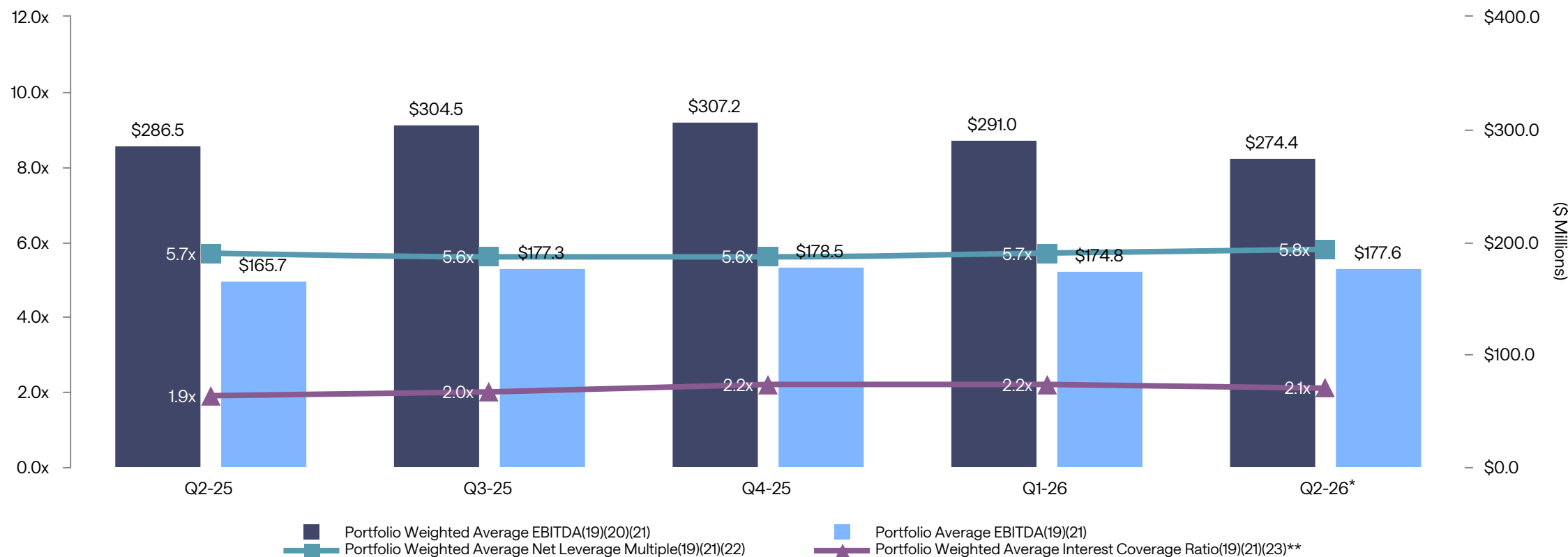
Investment Portfolio as of June 30, 2026*



Portfolio Activity

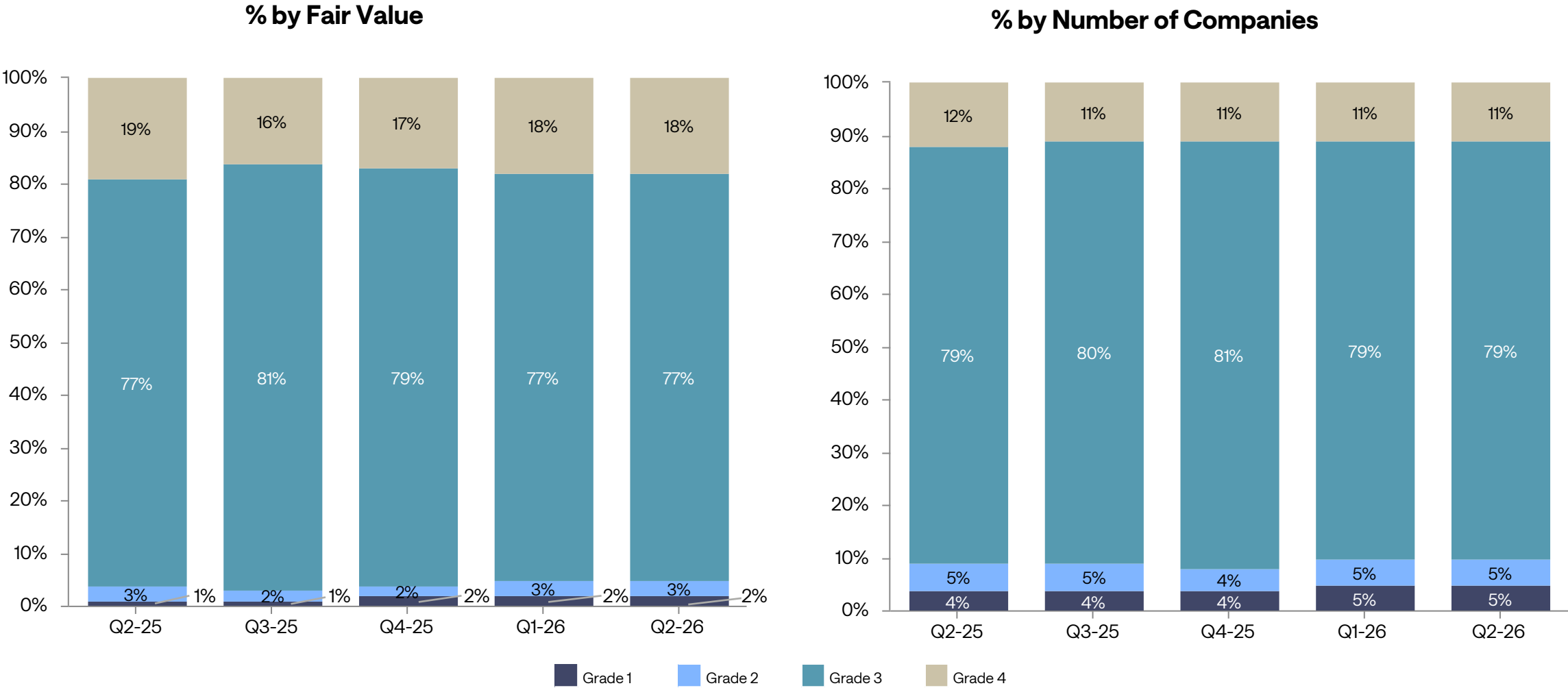


Portfolio Company EBITDA and Credit Statistics



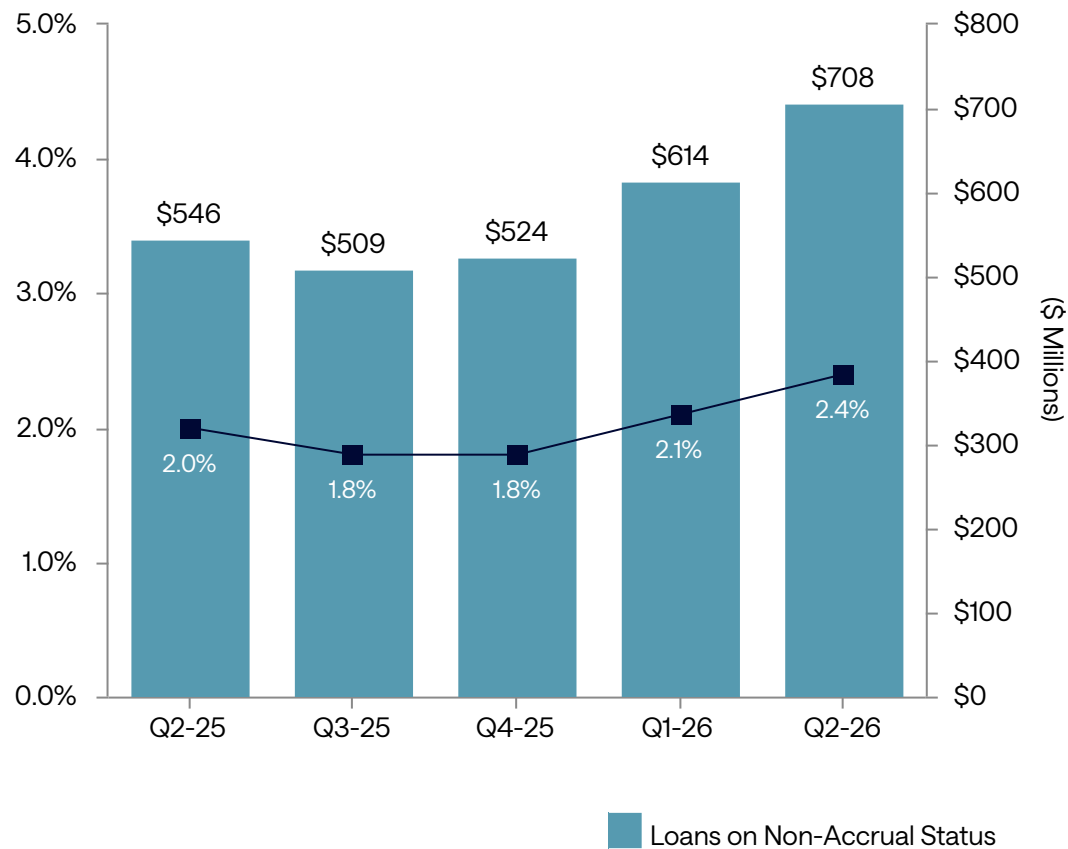

Portfolio By Grade²⁵

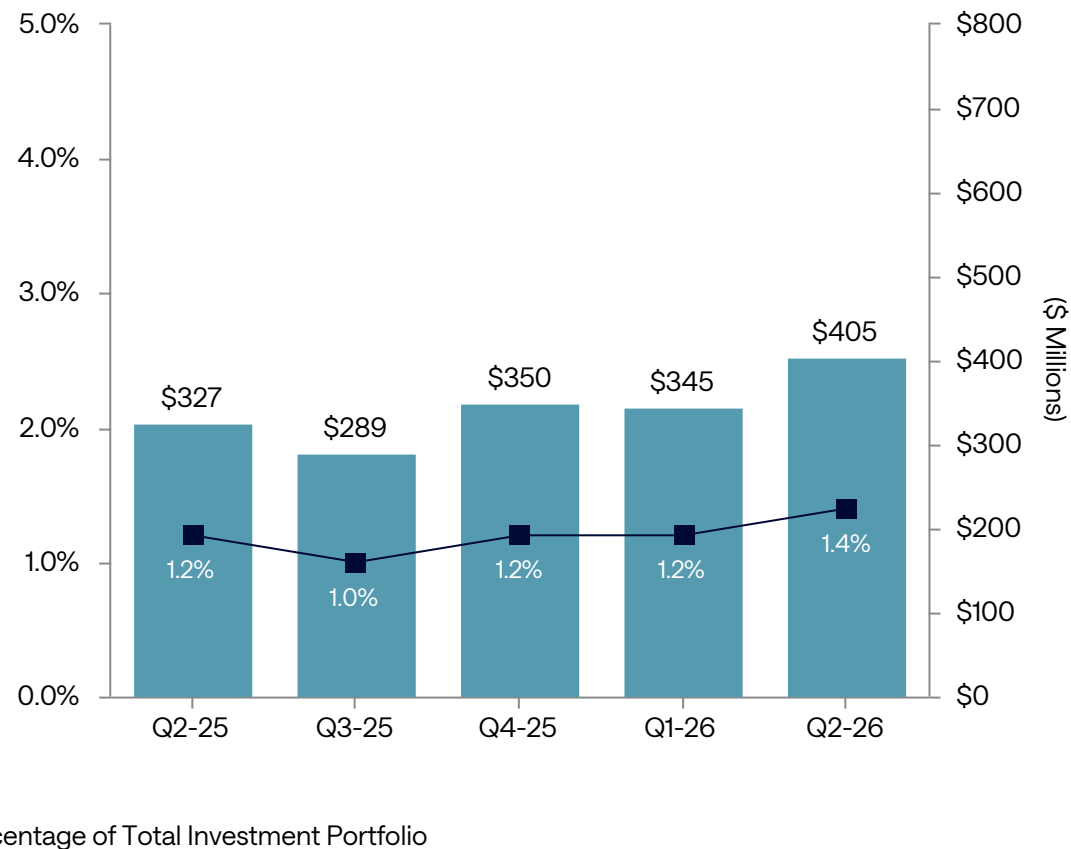


Loans on Non-Accrual Status

Investment Activity from July 1, 2026 through July 23, 2026

Ares Capital made approximately \$244 million of new investment commitments

- 47% were in first lien senior secured loans, 17% were in second lien senior secured loans, 5% were in subordinated certificates of the SDLP, 19% were in senior subordinated loans, 11% were in Ares Capital's subordinated loan to IHAM and 1% were in other equity
- 64% were floating rate, 35% were fixed rate and 1% were non-income producing
- Weighted average yield of debt and other income producing securities funded at amortized cost was 10.2%
- Weighted average yield on total investments funded at amortized cost was 10.0%

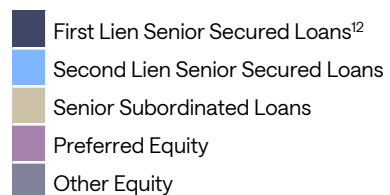
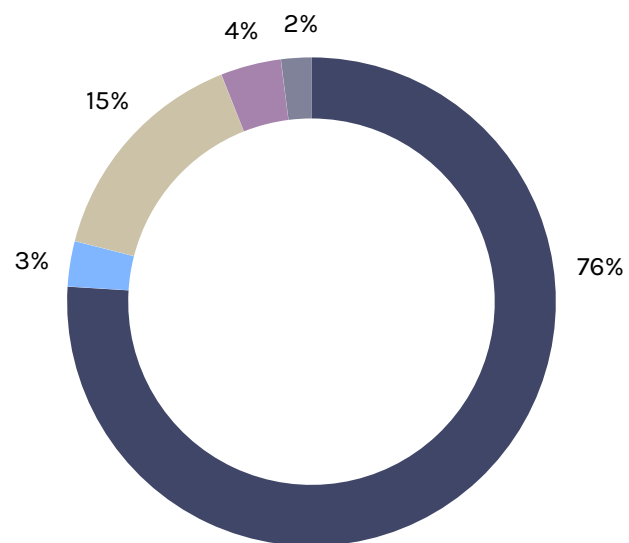
Ares Capital exited approximately \$132 million of investment commitments

- Total net realized losses of approximately \$2 million

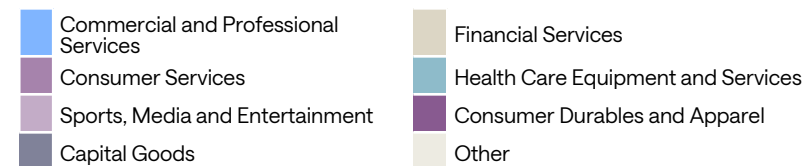
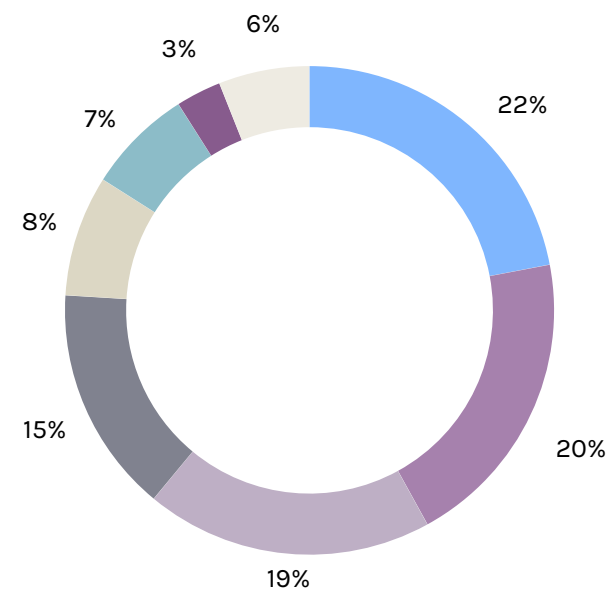
Investment Backlog

* In June 2026, Ares Capital established a \$1.0 billion commercial paper program (the "CP Program") pursuant to which it may issue short-term unsecured commercial paper notes, supported by the available capacity under the Revolving Credit Facility as a backstop liquidity source. Ares Capital expects to maintain available capacity under the Revolving Credit Facility at least equal to the amount of commercial paper notes outstanding under the CP Program. As of June 30, 2026, Ares Capital had not issued any commercial paper notes.

** In July 2026, Ares Capital repaid in full the July 2026 Notes upon their maturity.

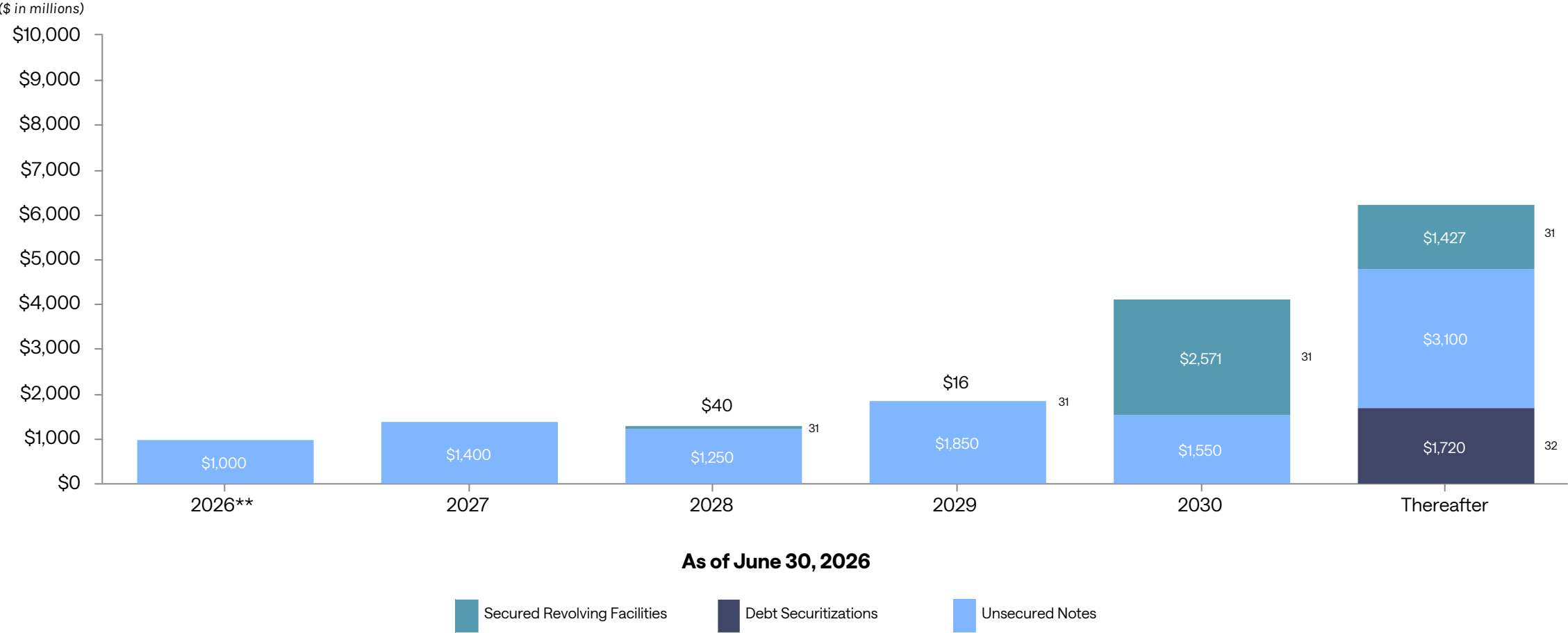

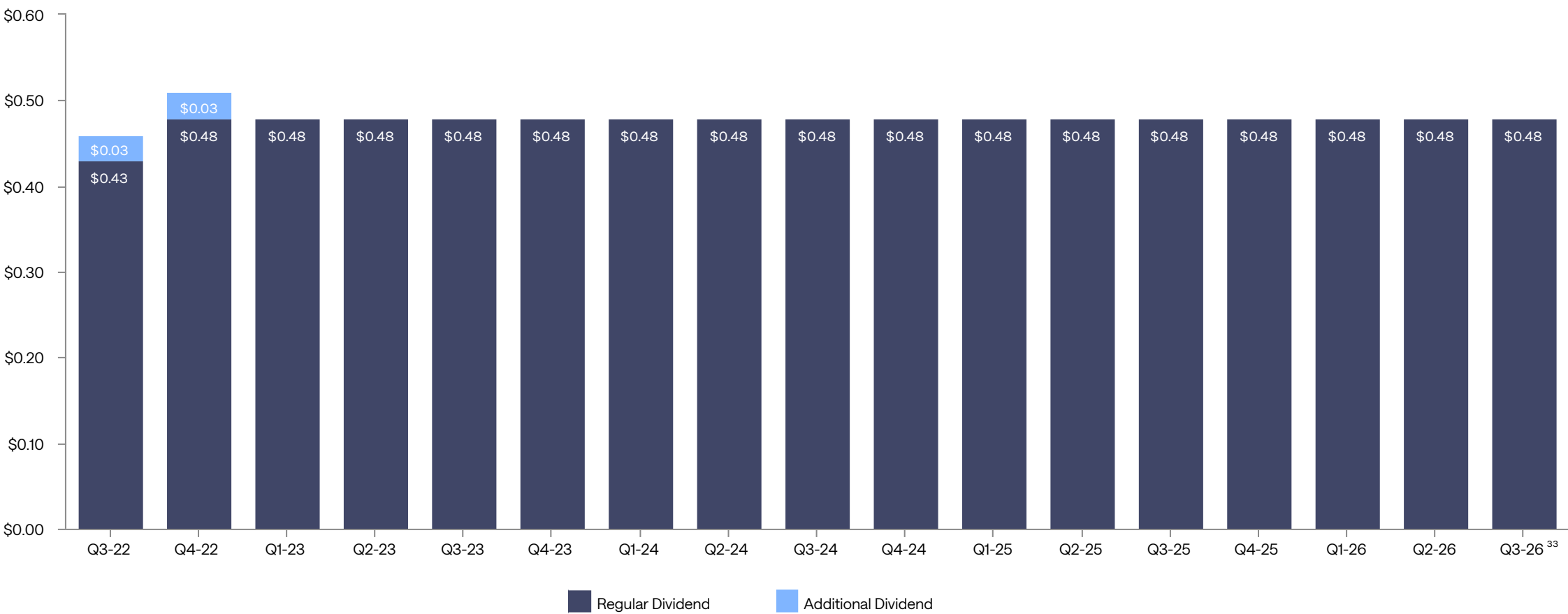
Debt Summary
